Disaster Preparedness Guide



YOUR CREDIT UNION IS PREPARED - Bayou Federal Credit Union has a detailed Disaster Preparedness and Recovery Plan in place. This Plan allows for the safeguarding of all credit union records, data, and cash. In the event of a disaster situation, your money and your account information are secured and protected. Off site computer capabilities help ensure a complete backup of Bayou Federal's critical computer systems and data. Through backup power systems and off-site computer capabilities, we work to restore service to members as quickly as possible, no matter what the disaster.

YOUR ACCOUNTS - In the event of a disaster situation, all efforts will be made to continue service or to resume service as quickly as possible. When Bayou Federal offices must be closed, access to your accounts is usually available by telephone, online, at ATM's, or through Co-Op Shared Branches nationwide. Remember, your accounts are insured by the National Credit Union Administration, a U.S. Government Agency. Not one penny of insured savings has ever been lost in a federally insured credit union like Bayou Federal.
